The small hamlet of Winter Harbour got its name in the 1800's when its sheltered harbour became a haven for sailing ships. Today, the docks are always busy providing modern fishing boats with the same welcoming respite.

To find your way to Kwaksistah Park campsite, follow the map on the back.

Kwaksistah Park campsite sits among tall trees, at the water's edge. You'll find fire pits, 9 campsites, picnic tables and a sheltered barbecue. This campsite is very rustic and not suitable for tents.

Kwaksistah Park campsite does not have running water or power. It is advisable to bring in your drinking water. There are outhouses provided for your use. Firewood may be provided. Please keep your fires small – you are camped amongst a thick forest of trees.

A boat launch for very small boats is at the campsite for your use free of charge.

RATES: \$15.00 per night if someone comes to collect. Reservations are not being taken for summer of 2009. First come first serve. We ask that you do not stay more than 14 nights.

Please take your garbage with you when you leave.
